Both survivors and child witnesses of Intimate Partner Violence (formerly known as Domestic Violence) commonly experience trauma. Being aware and able to recognize dangerous personality types and emotional and behavioral responses of child witnesses allows us the opportunity to intervene and therefore improve the safety of children and survivor parents and create a framework for recovery.
