Ruth Wheeler is one of CCKids' featured caregivers this month during our celebration of Intergeneration Month. Relatives and fictive kin who care for children in the dependency system can become licensed in the state of Florida.

Inter-generations Keep CCKids Caregiver Strong this September

Port St. Lucie – Ruth Wheeler is not only a caregiver to a 9-month-old little girl; she is helping to keep family connections, both by welcoming the baby's mother to events and by coordinating fun activities with the baby's siblings.

She is what we call a non-relative caregiver - a neighbor, teacher or family

friend who steps up to take care of a child to keep them out of the foster care system.

"At first, I wasn't going to do it," she said. "But I'm attached to the young lady and all her kids. I just didn't want the baby to fall into foster care."

Ruth says the baby's Guardian ad Litem - a child's representative in court - tells her that she is doing the work of a foster parent.

"I don't feel like a foster parent; I feel like I'm this baby's grandmother."

What's the difference between a licensed foster parent and a licensed relative or non-relative?" Foster parents are licensed to take in any child in the foster-care system, while licensed relatives and non-relatives are licensed for a particular child in order to keep them out of foster care.

Licensure, while not as stringent a process as it is for licensed foster parents, opens up a world of resources and financial and emotional support to grandparents, aunts, uncles, teachers and neighbors (and the list goes one) who care for children in their families and communities.

Ruth encourages anyone who is asked to consider becoming a caregiver.

CCKids Receives Critical Funding

The money is in the bank!

CCKids this week received its muchawaited allotment of funding from the Florida Department of Children and Families' Risk Pool, a store of money reserved for emergencies within the state's network of local child-welfare communities.



"We received \$2.05 million of the \$3.2 million requested," said Lauren Hahn, CCKids Chief Financial Officer.


The allotment, though short of what CCKids had requested, will be enough to make it through the calendar year, Hahn said.

CCKids will have another opportunity to request additional funds this winter.

It's necessary, Hahn said, because the organization's out-of-home expenses are increasing due to more children coming into care and with higher levels

of trauma.
