

Manicure Movement Gets a Soft Launch; Throttle Opened on 1K for Kids and Recruitment Campaign



**Fort Pierce -** April is a month away, but CCKids is gearing up for National Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention Month a few weeks early.

We kicked off the 2024 Manicure Movement an education campaign to raise awareness for the issues of child abuse, neglect and abandonment - during a quarterly all-hands staff meeting last week. Staff painted one nail blue to represent the one in five children who experience abuse by age 18 and recommitted themselves to the prevention of child abuse.


Next, we will take the campaign's message to

the community in April, a month formally reserved for child-abuse prevention and education events.

The early launch is partly due to CCKids' plans to bring all 2024 events under the umbrella of a single, yearlong foster-parent recruitment campaign. That campaign - 25 by 2025 - will highlight the community's need for foster parents and set a goal of adding 25 new foster homes to the area by January.

The Manicure Movement will serve as a sort of teaser for 25by2025, which will officially kick off during the 1K for Kids & Story Stroll, scheduled from 9 a.m. to noon, April 27.

Registration is now open for the 1K, which features an interactive stroll along Port St. Lucie's beautiful <u>Hillmoor Lake Park</u> to celebrate our local foster families.
