About 130 children in Okeechobee and the Treasure Coast went home to stronger, healthier families this past year after time apart for a variety of reasons – most commonly substance-abuse or mental-illness issues that can be overcome through local resources and a strong support system.


It's a special cause for celebration when children are returned to their

own homes, said Jerra Wisecup, CCKids' licensing and caregiver support specialist. It's a hard road and takes a lot of work.

"That's what we celebrate in June, during National Reunification Month," she said.
