#### **GFNF Child Summit Recap**


Several CCKids team members attended this year's Guardians for New Futures (GFNF) Child Summit, a two-day event offering high-quality training and professional development for child welfare providers on the Treasure Coast. The summit featured a wide range of expert speakers and panels addressing critical issues affecting children and families.

Highlights included the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) Panel, where

professionals from law enforcement, child protection, and advocacy organizations discussed strategies for supporting children and families impacted by abuse. Staff also watched a moving video testimony from an adult male abuse survivor, offering powerful, firsthand insight into the long-term effects of childhood trauma.

Other standout sessions included "Autism Spectrum Disorder: Diagnosis and Treatment Trends" with Dr. Brandi Rials of Palm Beach Behavioral Health & Wellness, "Growing Up in a Porn Culture: The Social, Emotional, & Cognitive Effects & a Public Health Solution" with Dr. Amanda Sanchez, Director of Programming at CultureReframed, and "Digital Predators: The Rise of Al-Facilitated Child Exploitation" presented by Detective Brian Broughton of the Martin County Sheriff's Special Victims Unit. These sessions provided staff with practical strategies and deeper understanding of the complex challenges children face today.

The summit was an inspiring opportunity for CCKids staff to enhance their skills, connect with fellow professionals, and bring back valuable insights to strengthen support for children and families across the Treasure Coast.

We offer a continuum of services for children and families referred by DCF to protect them from abuse, neglect, or abandonment. Our services focus on keeping children safely out of foster care whenever possible, while providing comprehensive support for those who must enter care. Children in care are supported until they can return home, achieve permanency through adoption or permanent guardianship, or transition into adulthood with our post-18 programs. All services are designed to achieve the following outcomes:

#### SAFETY

We safeguard children from abuse and neglect. Whenever possible and appropriate, our services help keep children safely at home with their families.

#### PERMANENCY

We ensure children have stability and permanency in their living arrangements while supporting the preservation of family relationships.

#### WELL BEING

We support a child's well-being by providing access to medical, dental, mental health, and substance abuse care.

We help families strengthen their ability to meet their children's needs and make sure every child has the educational resources they need to succeed.
